DEXTER ELKS DONATES \$500.00 TO HOPE INTERNATIONAL

It is my honor to report to the members of the Dexter Elks that on March 1, 2014 I was able to present a check for \$500.00 to Hope International. This is money we received from the Gratitude Grant from the Elks National Foundation for meeting our pre-capita this year. Hope International is a locally run charity under the guidance of the Light House Christian Center and Reverend Tim Russell in Dexter, Missouri. Hope International has in the past donated clothing, food, water and personal hygiene items to those in need during natural disasters. As well as those who need a hand up when times are difficult. Also Hope International runs a food pantry and nonprofit thrift store in Bernie, Missouri. On March 1, 2014 the members of Lighthouse Church and volunteers gathered at the Bernie Armory to hold a food packaging day. Several tables set up in assembly line fashion and crowded around by workers in hair nets and rubber gloves and wearing some of the biggest smiles I've seen while working hard to put together nearly 90,000 meals for distribution to those in need. It was my pleasure to meet Gale Jordan, Vice-President of Hope International, whom I presented the check to. Gale was working hard keeping his workers supplied with the items needed to bring each batch of food together. Gale explained to me what they were doing at each table. A heat sealable bag was placed below a large funnel, a scoop of seasoning was dumped in followed by several dried vegetables and grains. The bag was then sealed and boxed up for storage and distribution. Each bag is able to supply 10 one cup servings after being cooked. Gale and Reverend Russell were very grateful and appreciative of the donation. They explained to me that the \$500.00 donation they would buy supplies for 2,500 meals. My fellow Elks, this is what we are all about! Supporting a local group that upholds what we as Elks stand for Charity, Justice, Brotherly Love and Fidelity towards those in need. I am proud to be an Elk, I am grateful to represent the Dexter Elks Lodge in such a manner. Thank you to all of the members who support our Lodge, the noble works and causes we support. I would like to say Thank You to Jeff Dudley for bringing this event to our attention, and suggesting them for the donation.



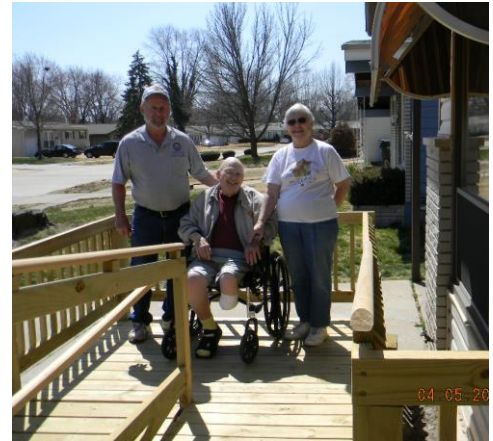
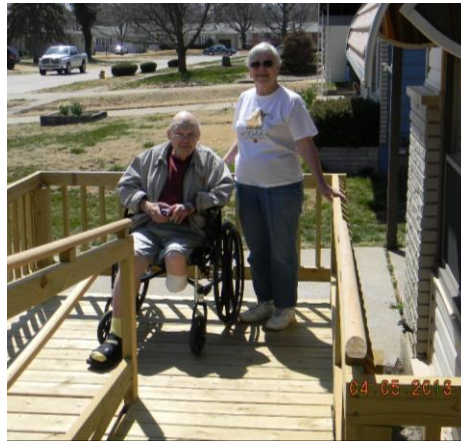

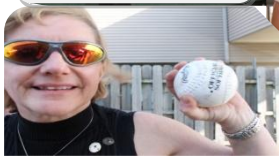
