Auditing and Accounting



By the time you read this we'll be in the 21-22 Lodge year and as of this writing 46 of the 74 Missouri Lodges aren't compliant with the Financial Reporting System (FRS) for the 19-20 Lodge year. They either have 3-31-19 beginning balances that don't match what was reported for that year or their 19-20 numbers don't match their 990. If you are one of those Lodges you need to contact either myself or Frank Kerby for help in getting your issues fixed. Some-

one with the Lodge has been notified multiple times of your specific issue.

The FRS is not going away and there is soon going to be a time when fines will be levied against Lodges that are not compliant with all the requirements, including being current with all your monthly financials and your budget. Also Lodges must file their Form 990, 990-T and State returns by August 1st by uploading them to the Grand Lodge Website. There are no exceptions and fines will be imposed for late filings. Extensions of time requests filed with the Internal Revenue Service are not recognized by Grand Lodge. Failure to file on time with Grand Lodge will result in the imposition of penalties starting at \$100.00 per month or portion thereof that the return is late up to a maximum of \$500.00.

There is a brand new Auditing and Accounting Manual that was just posted the first of March. I urge everyone that has any responsibility in the financial management of the Lodge to read it. It is much more instructive and we attempted to write it in a way to make it much easier to understand. There were some changes to the Chart of Accounts; before anyone panics they were only additions that were done at Lodge request.

One thing I need to point out is that the implementation of the FRS did not do away with the responsibilities of the Lodge Auditing and Accounting Committee. G.L.S. Section 13.040 enumerates the duties and responsibilities of the Committee and the members should be familiar with all of its provisions. Subsection (h) sets forth the requirement for three reviews during the months of July, October and January. If the Auditing & Accounting Committee is conscientious and carries out its duties responsibly, the Lodge will have much greater assurance that it is com-plying with the Statutes; that accounting data is reliable and that the budget process is being used properly to manage the financial affairs of the Lodge. The Committee must report on completion of their reviews to the Lodge at a regular Lodge meeting. This is one Committee whose term laps over the end of the Lodge year. The Members of the Committee continue with their duties until the FRS for the month of March is completed, reported to the Lodge and filed with the Grand Lodge for the fiscal year in which it is appointed.

This will be the last of my articles concerning A&A issues. After more than 8 years my time is up and I will be off the Committee as of July7th. I appreciate the time and effort all of you have put into trying to make your Lodge as fiscally sound as possible and in keeping up with all the statutory requirements. Hopefully I'll see you around the State and at Conventions when I'm just another damned ole PSP.

I hope this finds all Missouri Elks doing well in this new year. The Benevolent Trust and Mobile Dental Program has seen its share of difficulties as most of us all have. Through these hard times we as Elks have kept on delivering for those in need. I'd like you to hear from our home-grown hero of our Dental Program, one who thinks of others before himself.

Continue to be safe and always take care of those who need our help.

Brian Crawford, Director, Missouri Elks Benevolent Trust Hello my fellow Elk friends:

It is an honor and privilege to be your staff dentist for so many years, and I want to thank each and everyone of you for your continued support to the "Elks Benevolent Trust", and by that support, ensures our continual presence in the Missouri urban and rural communities, providing this very important and consequential dental service for the special needs, especially now with the negative impact of the COVID-19 outbreak and pandemic.

The direct consequence of the COVID-19 pandemic required us to shut down our service temporarily from the end of March to the beginning of May, to allow time to develop new protocols based on scientific evidence available at that time, so we could address the COVID-19 challenge. The revised protocols established, would focus on fomenting a safe environment for both staff and patients, to ensure that the viral transmission would be avoided. The great news is through the diligent and hard work of Dr Matthew Tinnel, Director of the Elks Mobile Dental Program, Truman Dental Clinic personnel and Elk's staff, effective protocols were put in place and the proper PPE (Personal Protective Equipment) was obtained, which allowed us to get back serving the Missouri population with pleasure.

Currently, I can say the Dental Program is running full schedule, with the exception of some decrease in patient load due to the new protocols, or people's fears to the COVID. We are providing our historical services, which include dental exams, X-rays, cleanings, fillings and extractions. We are now getting frequent requests for our dental services, which has been the result of COVID-19. We are there for them. That is what this program is all about and it depicts the most important aspects of the Elks Dental Program, which I call "Goodwill ". This program goes beyond dentistry, it also serves as a guiding light to afford holistic health services. If our patient needs a dental specialist, we follow that individual to the best of our ability to ensure they get that dental care needed. It is not uncommon that we get patients that have uncontrolled high blood pressure, uncontrolled diabetes, or other chronic medical conditions, we help guide them to get proper medical care, so they get medically stabilized, in order for them to be treated safely in our dental clinic. I could go on with many more examples, but it has been proven over and over again that this program gives many individuals a feeling of hope, trust, security and respect. The Elks Mobile Dental Program lets people know that the Elks Care and Elks Share, because they see it and live it in action.

I am very proud to be an Elk and be part of this very incredible and prodigious program. I know it has been a very difficult time in our history, both socially and financially to the Elk family, due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Foremost, I pray that you stay safe and healthy, but also, I hope that you can financially contribute whatever is within your possibilities, to help sustain this unique and wonderful dental program for the special needs in the State of Missouri. Also, the Elk Dental Staff wants to thank all the Lodges that have accepted us and sponsor our stay to treat patients at their facility, and also, we gratefully thank the Elks who transfer the Dental Van to the next location on the schedule. Hope to see you soon.
